### Family Information

TARQUIN is bred from a great cow family. Deangate Queenie 9<sup>th</sup> his dam, is one of 3EX and 2VG maternal sisters and she is milking in her 13<sup>th</sup> lactation having given 108 tonnes of milk so far. Queenie 9<sup>th</sup> was classified EX94 in her 12th lactation with EX94 Body, EX97 Legs & Feet and EX90 Mammary. The Queenies have won the cow family award in the Staffordshire herds' competition on two occasions, ahead of all the Holstein families.

Tittenser Hylke, the sire of Tarquin, was initially proven in Ireland and he now has a widespread proof in the UK with more than 1000 milking daughters. Hylke is outstanding for fat and protein percentages and he is also one of the top ranking bulls for daughter fertility.

### Daughter Information

TARQUIN daughters combine many of the traits that Friesian breeders are looking for. Tarquin sires Friesian type cows, with shallow udders and strong ligaments. Many of his daughters are out of part Holstein cows and Tarquin adds strength and longevity.

### Mating Information

TARQUIN provides a good cross for Holstein breeders looking for a slightly stronger Friesian type cow. He is also ideal for Friesian breeders to use on daughters of Marshside Rocket 3<sup>rd</sup>, Newfailand Mr Frosty, Foxhole Panatella, and Dovea Sem.
